Who can take the GED® in Iowa?

You may take the GED® tests in Iowa if:

- you are at least 17 years of age or older,
- you are not enrolled in high school, and
- you have not graduated from high school.

What is my first step?

The first step toward preparing for your GED® is to connect with a Community College Adult Literacy Program in Iowa. A qualified, supportive instructor will help you determine where you need to begin your preparation and which learning methods will work best for you. Official practice tests and GED® tests are administered through the community colleges at multiple locations and at various times during the day to help meet your needs.

Once you have your starting point, you can combine study at the Community College and study at home using i-Pathways to prepare to take the GED® tests.
